**Public Notice** 

The Region of Durham has updated the Regional Cycling Plan to ensure that it aligns with the Region's vision and strategies, as outlined in the Region's current Transportation Master Plan (TMP). The Durham Regional Cycling Plan 2021(RCP) is a strategic planning document that defines the policies, programs and infrastructure needed to support cycling in the region. The RCP addresses the needs of the cycling network by recommending a Primary Cycling Network that balances the needs of cycling at both the Regional and local level, while making recommendations to enhance safety and accessibility, promote sustainability, reduce environmental impacts and support economic development.

The RCP 2021 was initiated in 2019 and endorsed by Regional Council on October 27, 2021 (refer to item 9.5).
