First Extension to Pay Fine Application (Filed after November 1, 2021)

The Clerk of the Court may grant your extension pursuant to s. 66.0.1(2) of the *Provincial Offences Act*. An extension is granted with the expectation that the fine will be paid in full by the due date. For the Clerk of the Court to consider granting your extension, it is expected a good faith payment(s) be made within the last year on the following scale:

Total Amount Owning in Fines:	Minimum Good Faith Payment Amount:	Max. Time to be Considered
\$1-\$250	\$30	6 Months
\$251-\$500	\$40	
\$501-\$750	\$50	
\$751-\$1000	\$60	
\$1001-\$5000	\$70	1 Year
\$5001-\$10000	\$80	
\$10001 or higher	\$90
