COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Update

Current Eligibility (Phase 1)

- Adults 75 years of age and older, or who will be turning 75 in 2021
- Staff, residents and caregivers in retirement homes and other congregate settings* for seniors
- Health care and essential workers in the High Priority level, and in accordance with the [Ministry of Health's guidance on Health Care Worker Prioritization](#)
- Chronic home care patients 16 years of age and older **
- Indigenous adults and non-Indigenous adult household members
- Faith leaders who **routinely** provide:
 - End of life care & home visits to unwell persons
 - Care of the deceased, funerals, bathing, or other ceremony with direct contact with deceased persons
 - Pastoral care in hospitals/LTCHs/RHs or other vulnerable settings

*Congregate settings share amenities (e.g. shared rooms, bathrooms, kitchen, dining area, etc.).

**Family members and care providers for chronic home care patients are NOT eligible at this time.

How to Book a Vaccine Appointment

If you are eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, you can book an appointment two ways:

1. Visit www.durhamvaccinebooking.ca
2. Call 1-888-444-5113 for assistance to register by phone

To book an appointment you will need:

1. Telephone number (home phone or cell phone)
2. Home address including postal code
3. Email address (can be a family member)
4. Health Card Number (if available)

Vaccination clinics will be open in each municipality in Durham Region based on vaccine supply. Visit www.durham.ca/covidvaccines to find a clinic near you as well as FAQs about COVID-19 vaccines.
