## Protect your business

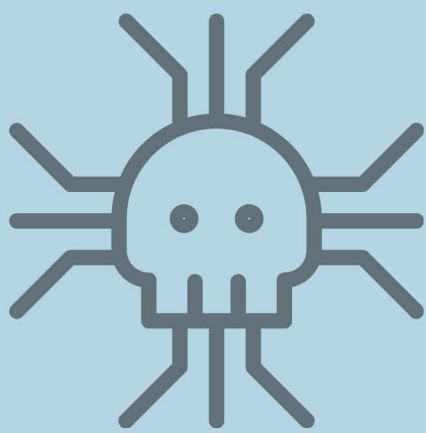


### Create policies

Hold your vendors accountable by building privacy and cybersecurity requirements into contracts.

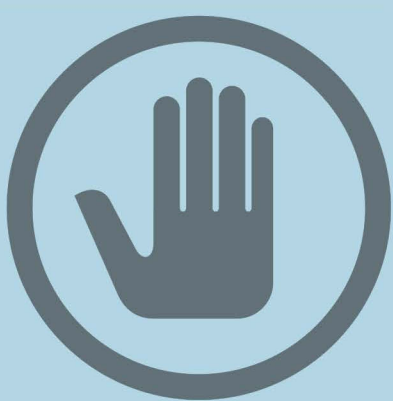


### Security tools

### Back up data

### Limit access
