Ontario Early Childhood Education (ECE) grants: Semester updates

Effective March 24, <u>Ontario ECE grants</u> began accepting applications for the spring/summer 2025 semester from past Qualification Upgrade Program (QUP) recipients. All other applicants can apply for the spring/summer 2025 semester beginning April 7.

Federal child care funding extension

On March 6, the Government of Canada reached an agreement with the Ontario government to extend the early learning and child care agreement until March 31, 2031. The extended agreement includes a three per cent funding increase every year for four years, starting in 2027-2028. The extended agreement will support continued access to high-quality, affordable, flexible and inclusive early learning and child care programs and services. Upcoming child care end dates for Fee Subsidy clients attending school

Many Fee Subsidy clients are in school programs that are ending in April. Clients with April closures are highlighted in the placement end column on the Fee Subsidy placement lists in the Child Care Operator Portal. Please remind these clients to contact their caseworker to determine if their child care Fee Subsidy can be extended. Verification of classes for the next semester is required for extensions.

Graduating students may be eligible for job search support, allowing child care to continue while seeking employment. April is a busy month with many changes and caseworkers will update the Child Care Operator Portal with extensions as soon as they receive information from their clients. For any questions or concerns, please connect with your caseworker.

Mobile ID and Benefits Access Hubs

The Region of Durham is hosting Mobile ID and Benefits Access Hubs this April and May. The hubs will help clients and residents living with low income to:

- Open a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP) and apply for the Canada Learning Bond.
- Access Social Insurance Numbers (SINs), birth certificates, and other forms of ID.
- Get their taxes filed for free.
- Sign up for the new Canadian Dental Care Plan.
- Learn about other income-boosting benefits that they may be eligible for.
