- Ensure all reprocessing is done in an approved, designated reprocessing area that meets current PIDAC guidelines.
- Ensure that the Biological Indicators and test strips for the high-level disinfectant are not used past their expiry date.

- Ensure all sterilization packaging is stored in a clean and sanitary manner.
- Ensure that medical equipment/devices that were previously sterilized without proper labelling are reprocessed and sterilized again with proper monitoring and labelling.
- Ensure that the dedicated cleaning brush is kept in good repair.
- Ensure there is a plan in place to replace the sterilizer with one that has a printout/USB.
- Verify and record physical parameters, chemical indicator monitoring results, load contents and person responsible for each sterilization cycle.
- Ensure proper training is provided to all staff involved with reprocessing.
- Ensure IPAC policies and procedures are complete and in line with current IPAC guidance.
