
# **Create policies**

Establish information security and cybersecurity incident management program policies and procedures.

#### Contracts

Hold your vendors accountable by building privacy and cybersecurity requirements into contracts.





# **Security tools**

Installing security tools can help prevent malware, quarantine suspicious files, and issue alerts.

## Back up data

Always backup information and systems in an offline environment. A ransomware threat holds less power when you have your data safely stored.





#### **Limit access**

Only allow users to access data if it is required to perform their job duties.

This will help protect important company information.

### **Educate staff**

Prioritize privacy and cybersecurity training for all employees to help avoid breaches and raise awareness to suspicious activity.
