# Theme Information

Below are brief descriptions and additional links related to eight key themes that support municipal programs and services areas.

The Region has made a commitment to being a leader in the community-wide transition to carbon neutrality and climate resilience. This means taking action to address the climate impacts of municipal infrastructure – including Regional buildings, the transportation network, waste and wastewater management, and clean water provision. We are also working in collaboration with our eight local area municipalities, and five conservation authority partners to invest in programs that support climate action by residents and businesses, as well as building resilience within the Region's agricultural and natural systems ecosystems. Sustainable efforts across the Region and its eight local area municipalities demonstrates our commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and seize economic opportunities related to the clean energy transition.

#### 1. Solutions for Information Technology and Smart Cities

Information Technology (IT) divisions provide leadership, and expertise to support IT functions and technology infrastructure, network communications, telephone services, and other technology solutions to provide effective Municipal services and efficient government operations. Some services include wide area and local network support, desktop support, application development, IT security, and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) services, and troubleshooting.

This thematic group also includes solutions for Smart Cities. In support of broader economic development objectives, the Region and local municipalities are implementing a Smart Cities/Intelligent Communities strategy and driving innovation forward to strengthen economic competitiveness and increase connectivity to support smarter, healthier, equitable, and sustainable communities.

### 2. Solutions for Transportation (Transit and Roads)

Municipal transportation services include the planning, design, survey, construction management, and maintenance of all municipal roads, bridges, traffic signals, and other road infrastructure. Other services include traffic by-law, traffic control crossing guard programs, and winter maintenance. Learn more about each municipality's works services below:

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This thematic group also includes solutions for Durham Region Transit (DRT). Durham Region Transit (DRT) is one of Ontario's largest regional transit systems, serving eight unique area municipalities. DRT operates scheduled bus services, On-Demand transit, and specialized transportation. Learn more about DRT.

### 3. Solutions for Health and Social Services

Public health and social services are Regional services. Each provide high-quality programs and services to Durham residents. Social services provide support and assistance to meet the needs of people in our community in a variety of ways including case management, counseling, employment support, financial assistance, housing, childcare and family support, and long-term care and senior services.

Public health works with community partners to promote and protect community health, prevent infectious diseases, inspect for health hazards, investigate occupational and environmental health hazards, and provide paramedic services. Health staff also work collaboratively with other Regional departments, Local Municipalities, and external agencies, to identify and plan for future local public health programs and services.

## 4. Solutions for Waste, Wastewater and Solid Waste Management

The Region is responsible for planning, design, construction, operation, and maintenance of water supply and sanitary sewerage services. Operations include the planning and design of all water treatment plants, water mains, reservoirs, water pumping stations, and sanitary sewers and sewage treatment plants. The Region is also responsible for systems policy development, planning and design, effective and efficient garbage, recycling and composting collection and processing service delivery to support diversion in Durham's residential sector. Other essential services include the development and management of all Regional water efficiency programs.

## 5. Solutions for Facilities (Operations and Emergency Services)

Facilities operations in the Region include the management of Regional facilities and leased premises including design, construction, operation, maintenance, and demolition activities, including Long-Term Care and Durham Region Police Service facilities.

At the Municipal level, facilities management oversees the maintenance of Municipal facilities, which include recreation centres, fire halls, Town Hall, and park facilities such as sports fields and splash pads. Fleet services include the maintenance of municipal vehicles and equipment.

This theme also includes Durham Regional Police Service, Fire Services, and Durham Region Paramedic Services.

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The Health Department is responsible for providing ambulance services for the Region of Durham and works with other community partners to help deliver emergency services. Paramedic Services respond to 9-1-1 calls, offer educational programs, and work in cooperation with Durham Regional Police Service and Municipal fires services as first responders. Durham Regional Police Service (DRPS) strives for the safest community for people to live, work, and play. DRPS is committed to providing quality service in partnership with the community. DRPS is comprised of four specialty units: 9-1-1 communications, auxiliary unit, field and patrol support, and serious/organized crime.

Fire services are the responsibility of the Local Area Municipalities. Each Municipality offers a variety of fire and emergency services including fire suppression, inspections, training, prevention and risk management, and education.

#### 6. Solutions for General Administration and Business Services

Each organization oversees finance, human resources, legal, and legislative services.

Finance divisions fulfill the legislative duties of the Treasurer, financial accounting and reporting of all municipal activities, and leads financial business planning and administration, and budget processing. Other operations include purchasing and property taxes.

Human resources provide administrative support to all departments and fair, transparent, and efficient support to employees including policy and organization development.

Legal Services coordinates and provide legal advice to Council, the Chief Administrative Officer, and municipal staff. Legal services also oversee the Provincial Offences Act-Court Services and Provincial Offences Act-Prosecution Services.

Legislative Services carries out the statutory duties of the Clerk as outlined in the Municipal Act and other provincial Acts, serves as secretariat to Council and its committees, and administers Municipal elections. This division manages Municipal records and archives and coordinates requests for information and privacy complaints under the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (MFIPPA).
